An Adapted Survey for Floridians with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities

The Florida Developmental Disabilities Council (FDDC) is conducting a survey to learn more about how people with intellectual disabilities and their families find sources of support. This survey is designed to address a shortage of direct support providers in Florida. Information collected in this survey will lead to new ways to connect people with supports. The survey is part of a larger research project that includes other tools like interviews and focus groups.



PROJECT: RESEARCHING PROVIDER SOLUTIONS



People with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) often need help in many areas of life.

They may need help finding a job, getting to work, taking care of a house, cooking, managing money, or other things.



Sometimes people with I/DD are helped by paid workers who are trained in the best ways to assist.

These paid workers are often called direct support providers.

Other times people with I/DD are helped by family, friends, or others.

These unpaid supports can also be an important way for people with I/DD to get help.

Who needs help?

There are three groups of people with I/DD who may need help from direct or informal support providers.

- People who receive services through the Florida iBudget Waiver
- People who receive services through the Consumer Directed Care + Waiver
- People who are on the iBudget waitlist or who have not applied for help



When people with I/DD in each of these groups cannot find the help they need, serious problems can arise.

Without services, people with I/DD can be stuck in their homes, with no way to become involved in their communities.



Their family members may have to miss work or quit their jobs to provide care for the person with I/DD.

What will this project do?

This project is a survey. The survey will gather information about how people with I/DD and their families locate sources of support.

The project will ask and answer the following questions:

- How important is it that people with I/DD have access to personal supports and services?
- Will better access to personal supports and services allow more people with I/DD to remain in their homes and communities?
- Will better access to personal supports and services allow more people with I/DD to have a better quality of life?
